SENIOR ROOM NEWS

WELCOME BACK!

A big welcome back to all of our senior students and families! We have a very busy and fun term planned with lots of celebrations along the way, students and I are looking forward to a fabulous term 4 to end the year.

LITERACY

This term, we've begun exploring our new class novel, His Name Was Walter by Emily Rodda. This unit places a strong emphasis on building students' skills in text response, vocabulary, author techniques, and comprehension to support their understanding of what they read.

A key focus throughout this book is inferring, or "reading between the lines" — a skill that helps students think deeply and make connections beyond the surface of the text. The class has already made a fantastic start in developing this ability.

At the moment, we are reading the novel together as a whole class. Soon, we'll be introducing reading groups twice a week, just as we did with *The Thing About Oliver* in Term 2. These small group sessions give students the opportunity to build confidence, share and refine their ideas with peers, and engage in meaningful discussions about the story.

Wow - Term 3 absolutely flew by! The final weeks were a highlight: the 2/3s truly stepped into their learning and poured lots of effort into their end-of-term projects. It was such a joy to see them take ownership of their learning. There was lots of problemsolving, persistence, and pride as they prepared to present at our expo. They did a fantastic jobsharing information reports and inquiry stories with family and friends.

One of my favourite moments this term was when the 2/3s visited the EYC and Kinder students and practiced reading







aloud. It was lovely to see them navigate with such kindness, modelling great leadership skills. And to top it off, in our last week, the kinder students surprised us with delicious cupcakes as a thank-you gesture! We all felt very appreciated, and I'm excited to continue these visits this term.

As we step into the final term of 2025, I can't wait to see where this next learning journey takes us. Here's a peek at what's ahead:

LITERACY & INQUIRY (EXPLORING CREATIVITY)

We'll deepen our work in narrative writing. After seeing how enthusiastic the 2/3s became about creative writing Fridays in Term 3 we're going to dive deeper in narrative writing. I'm especially excited to see the stories they'll craft — with stronger narrative structures, richer details, and greater confidence in their voice.

This ties into our Inquiry unit for the semester, "Frame by Frame." We'll be unleashing our creativity as we plan and produce stop-motion stories. We've already studied examples of how stop-motion is made over recent terms, so I'm sure that the students will feel primed and eager for this challenge!

MATHEMATICS & SPATIAL SENSE

We'll continue building fluency in the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication, division), focusing on solving word problems and thinking flexibly about strategy.

We'll also turn our attention to **Space** — developing spatial language, navigating with directional vocabulary, and investigating key landmarks. We might have to dust off our orienteering skills again, building on the fun we had during last term's orienteering day.

WELLBEING:

We had an engaging incursion with the Life Ed van toward the end of Term 3, focusing on Friends & Feelings. The Middles and Grade 4s did an excellent job investigating how to be kind friends and how to identify and manage a variety of big emotions with honesty and care. We explored how to shift negative narratives into more positive ones, and reframed mistakes as opportunities for growth. I'm excited to continue building on these ideas this term! - Ella 😊

The term so far...

LITERACY

This term, I am looking forward to sharing some of my favourite texts with the Juniors this term. We began by working through understanding the vocabulary in Rosie's Walk and also retelling the events of the story through illustrations. Working at word level the Juniors will consolidate the mastery of letter formation, sizing and spacing of letters and revisiting the understanding of open and closed syllables to establish spelling

SHAPE AND NUMBER VALUE KNOWLEDGE

We've been learning to describe shapes using words like straight lines, curved lines, corners, and sides. We've used rulers to draw

> straight lines, painted rectangles with sponges, and created colourful art inspired by Kandinsky's concentric circles! Subitising is a key maths strategy. We've practised subitising by looking at groups of shapes or objects and using and explaining strategies to work out how many there are.



INQUIRY

What does it mean to be creative?
That was our starting point!
Thinking of new and original ways to do things, we began our 'Not a Box' exploration by using our imaginations to turn ordinary boxes into something

completely new!

Just a small reminder that this service will be Closed on Melbourne Cup day, while this doesn't affect the children directly it does mean all staff will be non-contactable.


Term 4 means hats are now expected to be worn so please make sure that all children have a hat in their bags.


