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WELLBEING NEWS SCHOOL LUNCH IDEAS

Kids often get bored of sandwiches for a few simple (and very human) reasons:

1. Repetition fatigue

If sandwiches show up in their lunchbox every day, kids start to associate them with "the same old thing." Even if it's a good sandwich, too much repetition makes it feel unexciting.

2. Sensory monotony

Sandwiches usually have a similar **texture** (soft bread, same chewiness) and **temperature** (room temp or cold). Kids tend to crave variety — something crunchy, warm, or juicy can feel more satisfying than another cold sandwich.

3. Visual predictability

Children eat with their eyes first. A plain sandwich looks... plain. Other foods (like colorful wraps, bento boxes, or foods with dipping sauces) grab their attention more.

4. Taste development

As kids grow, their taste buds and preferences evolve. A sandwich they loved at age 5 might feel too sweet or boring at age 8 or 10.

5. Peer influence

At school, kids see what others are eating. If everyone else has pasta, wraps, or leftovers, their sandwich suddenly feels less appealing.

Here are some fun, healthy, and easy sandwich alternatives for kids' lunch boxes — perfect for keeping things interesting while still being nutritious and packable!

WRAPS & ROLL-UPS

- Tortilla pinwheels: Fill a wrap with cream cheese, turkey, and shredded carrot, then roll and slice into spirals.
- Lettuce wraps: Use large lettuce leaves instead of bread—fill with chicken salad, tuna, or hummus and veggies.
- Cheese and ham rollups: Roll cheese slices and ham together; secure with a toothpick.

MINI BITES & RICE-BASED IDEAS

- Mini rice cakes or rice crackers with hummus, cheese, or guacamole.
- Sushi rolls: Use cucumber, avocado, or cooked protein like chicken or crab.

PROTEIN-PACKED

- Mini quiches or egg muffins: Bake eggs with cheese and veggies in a muffin tin.
- Chicken skewers (boneless) or grilled

- chicken strips with a dipping sauce.
- Hard-boiled eggs with veggie sticks and crackers.

SNACK BOX / "LUNCHABLE" STYLE

Pack a little bit of everything:

- Cubes of cheese
- Crackers or pita chips
- Cherry tomatoes or cucumber slices
- Fruit (grapes, berries, apple slices)
- A small treat like a couple of chocolate chips or yogurt-covered raisins

CARB ALTERNATIVES

- Pasta salad: Use whole grain or veggie pasta with diced veggies, cheese, and a simple vinaigrette.
- Cold noodles: Soba or spaghetti tossed with sesame oil and soy sauce.
- Mini pancakes or waffles: Spread with nut butter or cream cheese for a fun twist.

SNACKY & FINGER-FOOD LUNCHES

- Fruit & yogurt
- Veggie fritters or mini savory muffins.

DAYS OF THE WEEK

In Maths, Juniors are learning about the days of the week and linking them to familiar events in our routines. Using The Very Hungry Caterpillar as our starting point, students have enjoyed exploring what happens on each day and making connections to their own weekly experiences.

INOUIRY

In Inquiry, our focus has been on discovery - seeing and finding new things! We started by watching a video of babies exploring new tastes and learning how their bodies work and watching their reactions to the new discoveries. Inspired, Junior

Room learners went on to investigate the yard with magnifying glasses, noticing details they hadn't seen before. They were then challenged to work with a partner to design an invention to help an animal, combining

creativity and teamwork to explore and learn together.

WELLBEING

Last week, we focused on recognising our own strengths and those of others, building strength based vocabulary and using it in our everyday. Junior Room learners are exploring what friendships look and sound like in the classroom and the yard, and take time to acknowledge when someone has been a kind and supportive friend.

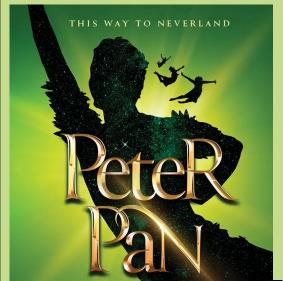
